The Crisis Clinic is staffed with Mental Health Clinicians, Registered Nurses and Psychiatrists. If you are not currently receiving mental services you are welcome to come to Crisis Services to receive mental health services. (If you have Medi-Cal or Healthy Families insurance you may call instead of walking-in, Managed Care Access at (209)468-9370 to

request mental health services). Although the name is Crisis, persons do not have to be in a "crisis" or an urgent condition to request our services. A triage evaluation by mental health professionals determines the level or urgency or crisis and the appropriate course of intervention.

Psychiatric Technicians and Mental Health Specialists staff the Crisis Intervention Center. During weekdays, consumers are initially evaluated for the appropriate level of services through a triage process. If there is a possible need for temporary, involuntary psychiatric inpatient care, then a Crisis Services clinician is to assess the consumer's urgent treatment needs.

CARE / FERPA - Energy Assistance Programs

California Alternate Rates for Energy Program (CARE). A monthly discount of 20% or more on gas and electricity. Participants qualify through income guidelines or if enrolled in certain public assistance programs.

Family Electric Rate Assistance Program (FERA). A monthly discount of 18% on

electricity only. Must be a household with three or more people. Participants qualify through income guidelines.
